
70th Anniversary of St. Pius X Catholic Women's League





On June 7th, 1954, Most Reverend Francis Carroll, Bishop of Calgary, decided to erect, in the North-West of the city, a parish named St. Pius X, in honor of the pope who founded the Diocese of Calgary. The parish was created from the west side of St. Joseph's parish. Our CWL Council began the same year.

First CWL Meeting of St. Pius X Council

The initial meeting was held in the school auditorium, and they began with the League Prayer, the same prayer we say to this day. Our first parish priest, Fr. Holland conducted the election of officers at the start. Elected President Adele Schwinghammer called the first meeting to order on October 13, 1954, with 39 members present. A membership fee of \$1.00 was instated. They decided to meet monthly in the auditorium until there was a place at the new church and each member would pay \$.10 at each meeting to cover the cost of the rent. It was suggested that refreshments be served at the meetings and that each member bring her own cup, saucer, and spoon. These women started a Sick and Visiting Committee to serve ill parishioners in their homes or in hospital.

Our council began with 39 members and has gone higher and lower over the years. Our current membership is 46. Membership began at \$1.00 and now is \$45.00. We honour our members for their service with pins reflecting the number of years they have maintained their membership. We are often giving out pins for 50, 60, and even 70 years of service as well as the Maple Leaf Service pin for exemplary time and talent shared with the League in its areas of faith, service and social justice.
